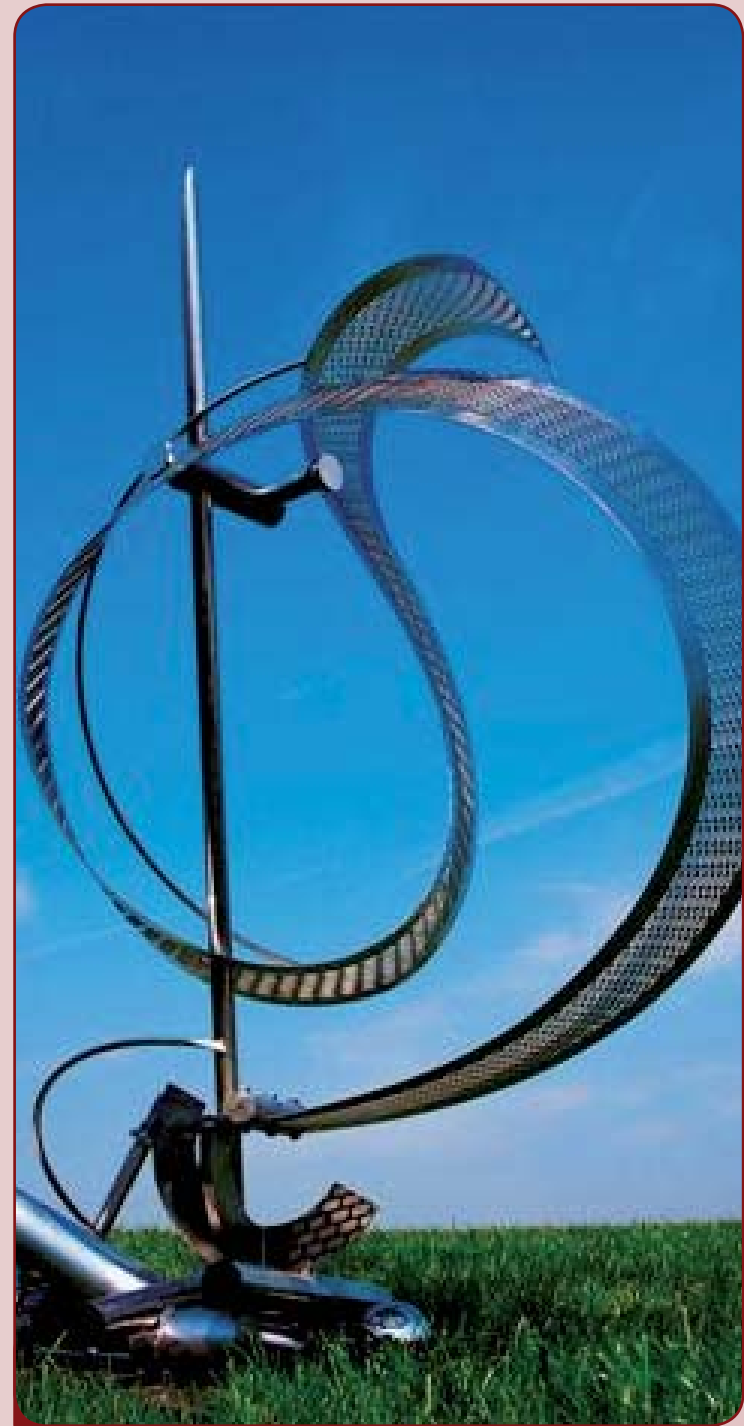
The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh opened the new facility in Didcot and unveiled the futuristic, stainless steel sculpture.
